

Why take an AP Course?

Taking the end-of-course AP Exam sends a powerful message to colleges and universities that a student is ready for them, and can enable students to gain admission, college credit, and placement into advanced courses.



- They provide academic rigor
- Students are exposed to a higher level of critical and creative thinking
- AP courses provide an atmosphere of like-minded individuals who have a passion for the same subject area



Information about AP

What's the difference between 'credit' and 'placement'?

- Some colleges award "Credit" for qualifying AP Exam grades. This means you actually earn points toward your college degree.
- Others award "Advanced Placement." This means you can skip introductory courses, enter higher-level classes, and/or fulfill general educational requirements.

Why Should a Student take the AP Exam?

Colleges and universities give credit for qualifying AP Exam grades, not AP Course grades.

It is important to remember that each post-secondary institution will have its own guidelines for accepting Advanced Placement grades:

For instance, here in Alberta, the University of Alberta currently accepts a score of 3 or more on the AP Exam for credit or placement. The University of Calgary requires a score of 4 or more for credit or placement. This is used as an example only; it is not meant to imply one institution's superiority over another.



Each student should investigate the post-secondary institutions of their choice to find out their particular acceptance guidelines and procedures.

Who Should Take an AP Course and Exam?

Our school uses the AP program's official policy for AP enrollment, which indicates that all willing students should be *considered* for admission to AP courses.

Be aware, the AP Courses are rigorous and academically challenging. To ensure success, be sure that the pace of learning is a good fit for your academic style.



Please note there is also a nominal fee for each AP exam taken. Please see your guidance counselor about current fee amounts.

English Literature and Composition: 10 preAP, 20-1 preAP, 30-1 preAP; 35 AP Math: 10 preAP, 20-1 preAP, 30-1 AP, 31 AP (Calculus), 35 AP Science: 10 preAP Biology and Chemistry: 20 preAP, 35 AP Social Studies: 10 preAP, 20-1 preAP, 30-1 preAP; 35 AP
